We have passed the half way mark and the end of term is fast approaching!

The children have already started looking at the features of a play and, in groups, will write their own. They will work on dialogues and writing direct speech, learning the correct punctuation. There will be a test at the end of the unit. We will then find out about a famous castaway, and learn how to write a recount, using chronological order. We will learn about modal verbs and adverbials of time.

In Maths we will be revising multiplication; long, short and the grid method. Then we will be working with negative numbers. Next we have fractions, comparing them and adding them. We will also revise how to find the perimeter and area of regular shapes.

In Science we have started to learn about 'Plant Life Cycles'. We will learn the parts of flowers and their functions, as well as learning about pollination, fertilisation and the ideal conditions for germination.

How were mountains formed? How do rivers affect the landscape? We are continuing to learn about the Earth and how it has been formed and then we will move on to 'Water', learning about this precious commodity.

In History we will learn about the Greek language and how many of our words have Greek origins. We will learn about some of the famous people that lived so long ago. We will investigate the Ancient Olympic Games and find out how it inspired the Modern Olympic Games. What things are the same and which are different?
